News

REF2029 Open Access consultation

The Library and RQI will be coordinating an institutional response to the [REF2029 Open Access consultation](#) and will be seeking input & opinion from across the Schools and PS divisions. The Library will be reaching out to individuals via email to gather feedback over the next few weeks, with an institutional response deadline of 17 June.

People, Culture & Environment pilot exercise

Institutions keen to participate in the [PCE pilot exercise](#) are required to submit an Expression of Interest to REF by 24 April, which the RQI team will be coordinating. If we are selected to participate, we anticipate the pilot will involve seven Sussex UoAs, of which the Heads of School have been notified, with a submission deadline in November 2024.

Participation in the pilot is expected to provide several benefits, including insights into what the final PCE submission format and process might look like, how ready our systems and processes are for this, and possible influence over how the process and data requirements develop, all of which should have a positive influence on our REF outcomes.

Sussex Impact Days

Don't forget to save the dates for this year's [Sussex Impact Days](#), taking place Tuesday 18 and Wednesday 19 June in the ACCA. Split across two days, this year's Impact Days will explore and celebrate the real-world impact from research at Sussex through panel discussions, workshops, and interactive impact surgeries grouped in the following themes: 'Let's talk about impact', 'What does impact success look like?', 'Avenues to impact' and 'Impact and the REF'.

Sessions include: a keynote from Phil Ward, director of Eastern Arc, exploring the value and opportunities of impact from consortium working; a showcase of projects funded by the Sussex AHRC IAA; a facilitated discussion between Policy@Sussex and external speakers on whether research still matters in public policy; alongside workshops from various teams from across Sussex (including RQI, Research Development & Initiatives, and IBP) and much more.

The full programme and registration details will be shared in early May.
